Key Points

We always travel in full Class A Boy Scout uniform, to and from our destination.

Class A Uniform means official BSA Scout shirt, pants, hat, socks, belt, and shoes.

Parents, please inform adult leaders of all prescriptions that your Scout is required to take.

Always pack long underwear on every trip. You never know how cold it will get at night.

Always pack your rain poncho at the top of your pack. You never know when it will rain.
