Everyone works together so that everyone achieves together. We do not desert the team.

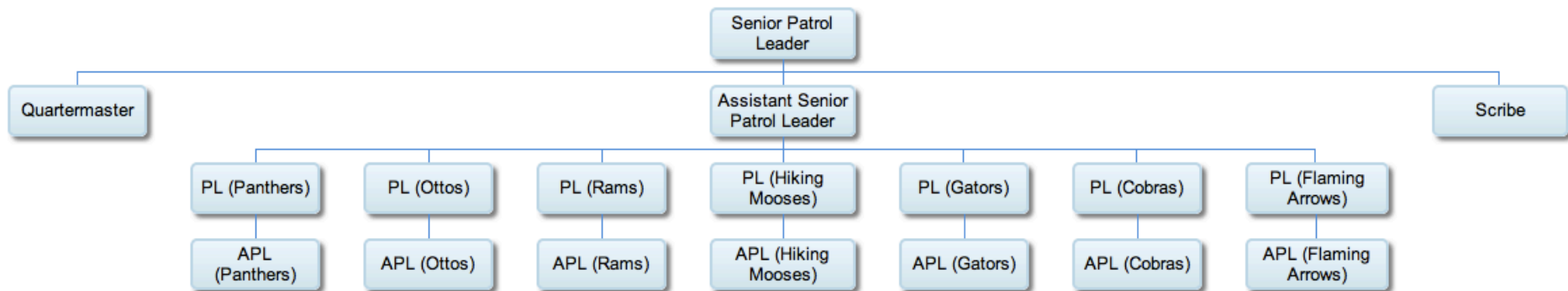
